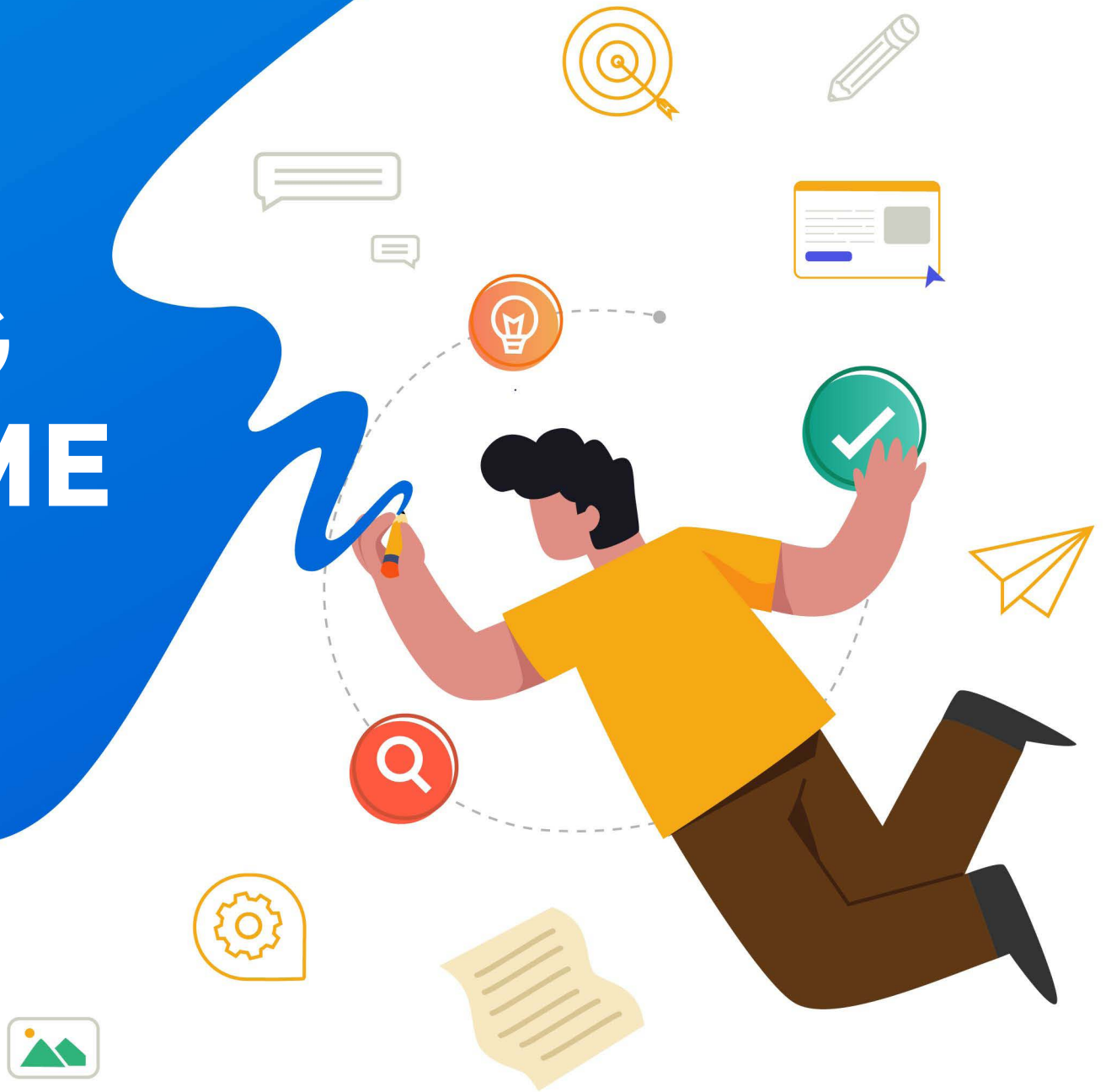

My time in Republic Polytechnic's Diploma in Environmental & Marine Science has laid a strong foundation for my understanding of environmental conservation in Singapore.

RP's emphasis on assessment beyond written examinations, through its problem-based learning pedagogy, introduced me to learning beyond the classroom and showed me that grasping concepts goes beyond rote learning. Breaking down problem statements daily equipped me not only with presentation, teamwork and research skills, but also with tenacity, curiosity and the confidence to adapt when facing obstacles, qualities I found especially valuable during my internship.

My internship with the Singapore Oceanarium, Final Year Project on the conservation of coastal horseshoe crabs, numerous field surveys, and Student Overseas Trips to Bintan and Kota Kinabalu pushed me to expand my network and experience conservation in action.

Beyond academics, RP places strong emphasis on exploring interests outside the classroom. I had the honour of serving as President of the Conservation Interest Group, where I discovered my passion for community-building and event planning.

This was most evident through organising initiatives such as Green Bootcamp @ North West 2024, in collaboration with North West Community Development Council, Sembawang Youth Network and City Developments Limited. Leading a team of 29 students, I planned and executed a competition that empowered youths from various IHLs to develop solutions for food sustainability and sustainable fashion under the guidance of industry professionals.

I am deeply grateful to Republic Polytechnic for providing an environment rich with opportunities. With the strong support of lecturers and staff, along with the encouragement of my parents, I was empowered to embrace challenges and push my limits.

RP's Problem-Based Learning approach played a pivotal role in my development, equipping me with the confidence and skills to think critically, collaborate effectively and lead projects both in and beyond school.

During my time at RP, I initiated and led overseas service-learning projects in Australia and Vietnam, supporting underprivileged students, as well as community projects for migrant workers and persons with disabilities. I also represented RP at national-level dialogues and events, including the Singapore Pharmacy Congress, which broadened my perspective on societal challenges and shaped me into a more well-rounded leader.

I was honoured to be placed on the Director's Roll of Honour for multiple semesters, and to receive module prizes and scholarships recognising both my academic efforts and community initiatives.

I am proud to be a graduate of RP and will carry its values with me as I strive to serve and make a positive impact, flying the RP flag high wherever I go.

SAS HIGHLIGHTS

The past year at the School of Applied Science was shaped by learning that extended well beyond the laboratory, as students applied scientific knowledge with purpose, empathy, and a growing global outlook.

Applied Chemistry students gained valuable global exposure through overseas immersions in China and Thailand, engaging with innovation hubs across automation, sustainability, and bio-innovation. In China, visits to Baidu Apollo, Canature and Lubrizol offered insights into autonomous driving, advanced water treatment, and beauty science, while engagements with GCL New Energy and NUSRI Suzhou highlighted renewable energy deployment and the commercialisation of research within a dynamic start-up ecosystem. In Thailand, students explored bio-innovation through FutureTales Lab, Baiya Phytopharm and Nabsolute, and deepened their regional perspectives through academic exchange with Chulalongkorn University.

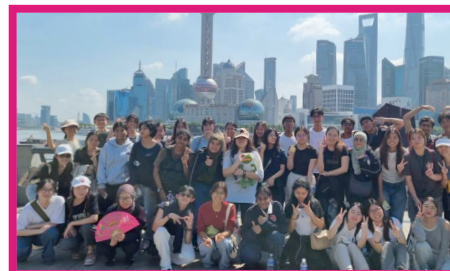
Industry collaboration was central to the Diploma in Biological Sciences through the Vege-Tales Challenge 2025, co-organised with the Singapore Food Agency and the Singapore Food Manufacturers' Association and supported by retail partners Little Farms and Sheng Siong. Working with food companies including Chocoworks, Fong Yit Kaya, Fook Sang Tong, SingShiok and Sustainabites, students co-developed ten vegetable-based, industry-ready prototypes that strengthened Singapore's food resilience while enhancing commercial viability.

Diploma in Biomedical Science (DBMS) students marked their final year with a strong focus on application, resilience, and community. Semester-long Final Year Projects, complemented by hands-on workshops and cohort activities, fostered critical thinking, teamwork, and confidence. Beyond project work, initiatives led by the DBMS Maven Interest Group provided hands-on workshops and peer-led activities that fostered curiosity, teamwork and a strong sense of community within the cohort.

Diploma in Environmental and Marine Science (DEMS) students brought sustainability learning to life through an overseas trip to Bintan, contributing to mangrove restoration and the Sea Turtle Conservation Project, alongside meaningful cultural exchanges with the local community.

Diploma Pharmaceutical Science (DPHM) students demonstrated compassionate care through sustained outreach with the National Kidney Foundation, supporting dialysis patients through befriending sessions and digital health education, efforts recognised with the NKF Partnership Excellence Award.

Together, these moments capture students growing through applying knowledge with purpose, responsibility, and confidence, as part of their ongoing #GreaterMe story.

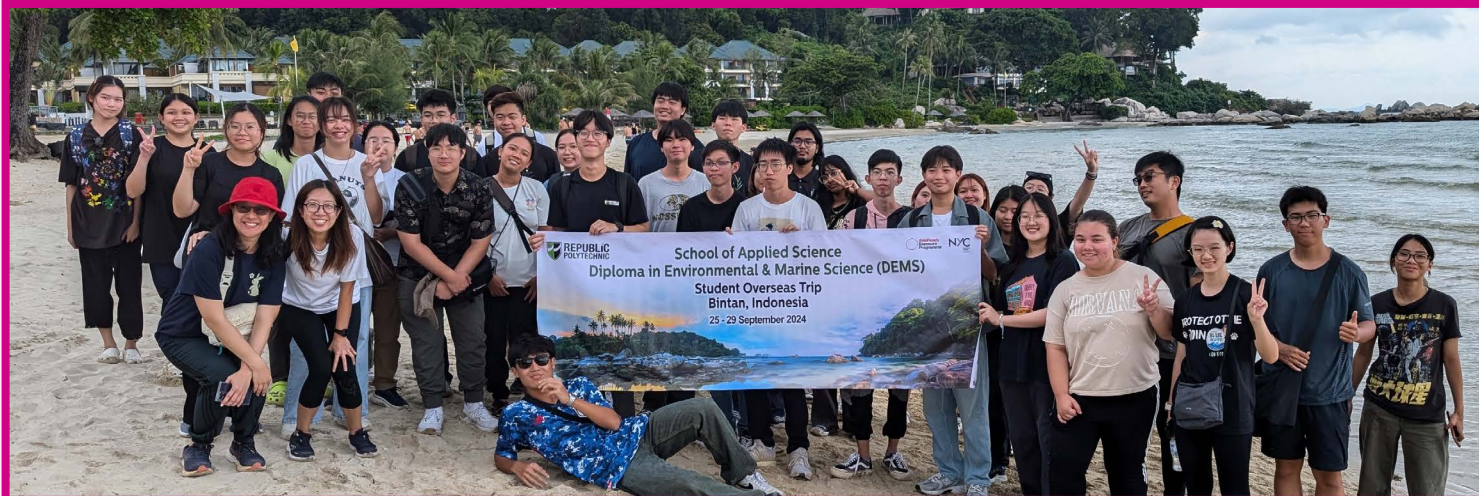

SBZ HIGHLIGHTS

A key highlight was the Financial Literacy for Youths (FLY) Event, now in its 15th edition. Supported by POSB, the Amazing Race-style programme engaged over 150 participants across four financial literacy stations. For student volunteers and participants alike, it was a powerful reminder of how business knowledge can create tangible value within the community.

The launch of the BYOB Accounting Gameboard Challenge further reflected this applied approach to learning. Co-organised with ACRA and developed by RP lecturers, the pilot engaged 144 participants from 17 secondary schools, translating accounting concepts into accessible, hands-on gameplay and strengthening students' ability to communicate complex ideas with confidence.

Industry readiness was also evident through the B216 Marketing Competition, where students partnered Mr. Bean to develop research-backed proposals for real business challenges, and through SPH Campus Radio, where Diploma in Mass Communication students recorded professional talk sets at ONE FM 91.3 and Kiss92.

Across every initiative, students showed up, stepped up and emerged more capable, building on a #GreaterMe journey that begins at RP and continues into their next chapter.

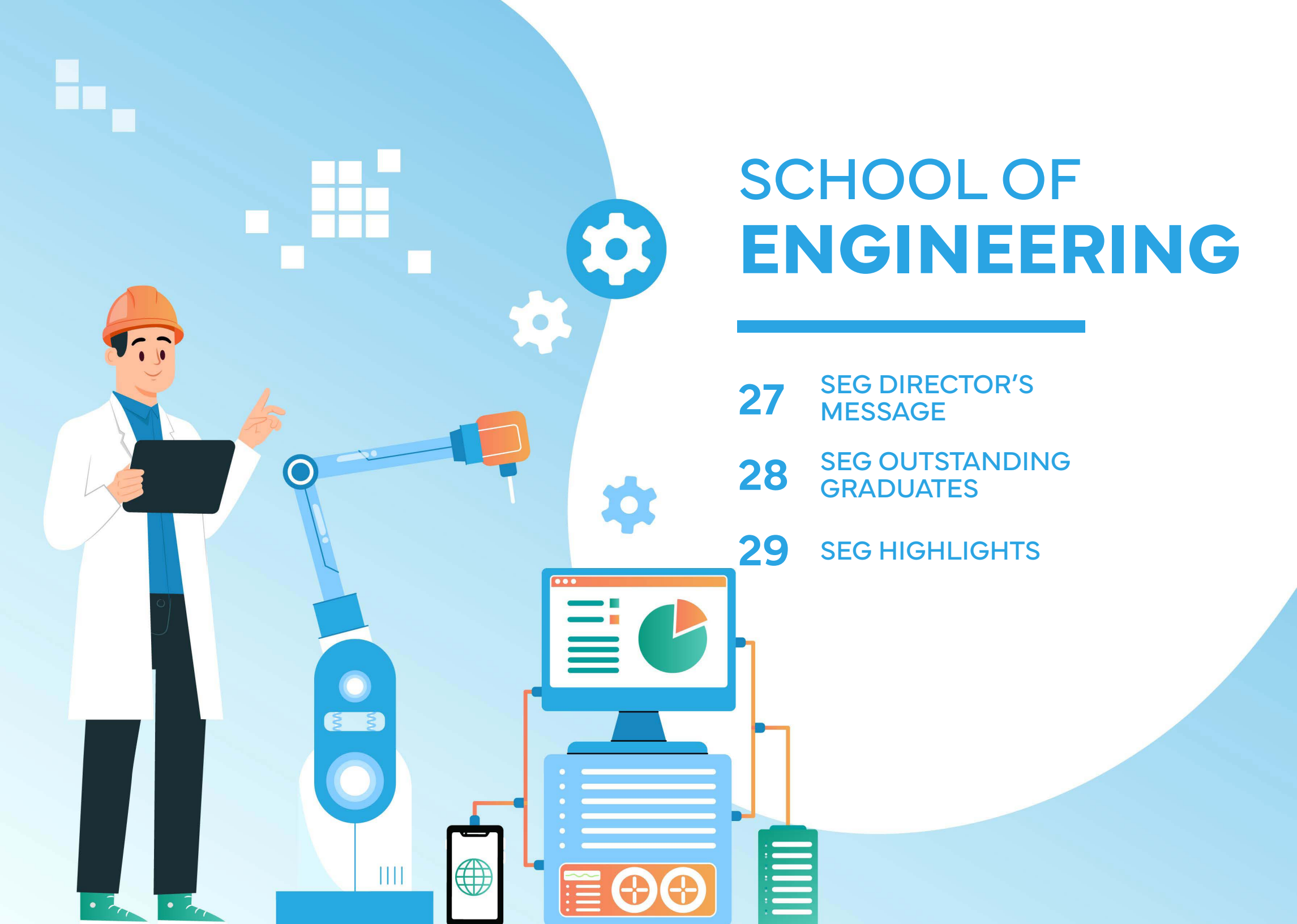
